Take comfort in RR's Ironwood Kitchen

■ Everything on menu is fresh, homemade — even the french fries

nother casual dining restaurant has joined the growing number of recently opened eateries in the Unser corridor near the new Presbyterian Rust Medical Center in Rio Rancho.

Ironwood Kitchen offers comfort food standbys like hamburgers, as well as New Mexican favorites like burritos, tacos and enchiladas.

The restaurant is in Unser Plaza, a small commercial development off Unser, north of McMahon. It is currently serving breakfast, lunch and dinner, Monday through Saturday. Owner Matt Moody said he decided to remain closed Sundays, even though he may lose out on some business, because he felt it was important for his employees to have time with their families.

Family time means a lot to Moody, who has five children. His goal with Ironwood Kitchen is to create an affordable and healthy eating-out destination for families.

"Nothing is processed; there's no pre-breaded items and nothing frozen. We even make homemade french fries," Moody said.

Moody grew up in Albuquerque and gained his restaurant experience running the Mesilla Valley Kitchen in Las Cruces.

"I've seen what works and what doesn't," he said.

What works, in his opinion, is serving people what they want. Ironwood will have breakfast items like omelets and chile-smothered burritos available all day. Lunch and dinner specialties include hot pastrami sandwiches and turkey quesadillas.

Moody picked the location near the border between West Side Albuquerque and Rio

Rancho because he lives nearby. The name reflects the decor, which features locally crafted ironwork and rustic-looking panels made of recycled wood. The 2,600-square-foot restaurant space has seating capacity for up to 70. Diners order items at

the counter and servers bring it to the table.

The section of Unser between McMahon in Albuquerque and Southern in Rio Rancho has seen several restaurants open in recent months, including an IHOP, Five Guys and Sushi King.
