Airbnb changes Santa Fe home design

Award-winning designer Lisa Samuel of Santa Fe's Samuel Design Group said her business didn't really feel the recession.

An interior and exterior designer in Santa Fe's luxury housing market, her clientele still required services during the housing crisis, from new construction to remodels.

"The market, even in higher-end residential, experienced a slowdown. I didn't, however. We stayed busy the entire time," Samuel said.

And these days, her clients aren't just designing for themselves, but for potential guests.

"We're definitely seeing a resurgence in something I find really interesting, and that is people are buying houses because the prices are down and then renting them as high-end rental places for vacation," Samuel said.

Call it the era of Airbnb. Samuel and her staff use a unique approach to design a home for both tourists and an owner who may use it for a couple months out of the year. Both users require a turn-key property and one that reflects
